APCC is particularly concerned about the potential for EPA's Clean Power Plan to be dismantled. The Clean Power Plan is a landmark step forward in the effort to reduce carbon pollution from existing power plants, which are the single largest source of carbon emissions in the U.S. According to a statement issued by the EPA in 2016, the Clean Power Plan is the result of a 2009 EPA determination that "greenhouse gas pollution threatens Americans' health and welfare by leading to long-lasting changes in our climate that can have a range of negative effects on human health and the environment. Carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) is the most prevalent greenhouse gas pollutant, accounting for nearly three-quarters of global greenhouse gas emissions and 82 percent of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions."

The Clean Power Plan is one of the most important U.S. efforts so far to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and meet our international obligations to combat climate change. It is the product of extraordinary public outreach—including hundreds of meetings and public

hearings—held during a three-year period in cities across the country. It is backed by overwhelming scientific evidence and solid legal findings. Repeal of the Clean Power Plan would be a catastrophic and costly step backward for our nation.

The paramount responsibility of the EPA is to protect the environment and health of U.S. citizens. The EPA must not sacrifice the well-being of our nation's citizens to serve the interests and increase the profits of industry polluters. APCC calls on the EPA to keep existing regulatory protections in place.
