



Landscape Runoff



Negative Effects on Environment

- Impaired water quality
- Excessive algal growth
- Thermal stress
- Habitat degradation
- Harm to wildlife



Negative Effects on the Community

- Health hazards
- Beach closures
- Economic impacts
 - Tourism
 - Commercial fisheries
 - Property values
 - Cost to restore

- 3. Install stormwater treatment systems








Conventional Stormwater Management

Stormwater Management Goals


Protect and improve:
