Exposure to many types of pesticides has been linked to adverse human health DeeDee Holt

impacts, including asthma, liver and kidney function, developmental disabilities,

birth defects, nerve and immune system damage, disruption of the endocrine

system, and cancer. Pesticide impacts in the natural environment have proven to be

equally problematic, causing harm to wildlife, including rare species and beneficial pollinators. Stormwater runoff containing pesticides can contaminate freshwater

ponds and streams, coastal bays and estuaries, and water supplies—which is of

particular concern across the Cape Cod region due to the sensitive nature of our

water resources and the Cape's reliance on groundwater as the source of its drinking **Kris Ramsay**
