




# **Red Brook**

### Falmouth/Mashpee

The Red Brook Road culvert, shared Mashpee and Falmouth, severely damaged, blocking fish passage and water flow. Immediate repairs are needed to fix the failed culvert and dam. The project aims to restore the entire river, including acquiring and conserving lands. Community input is crucial to the restoration shape plan. Engineers are working on designs to remove the old structure, raise road for better flood protection, and water improve quality. Next steps involve completion of the culvert replacement and planning for the full river and bog restoration.
