



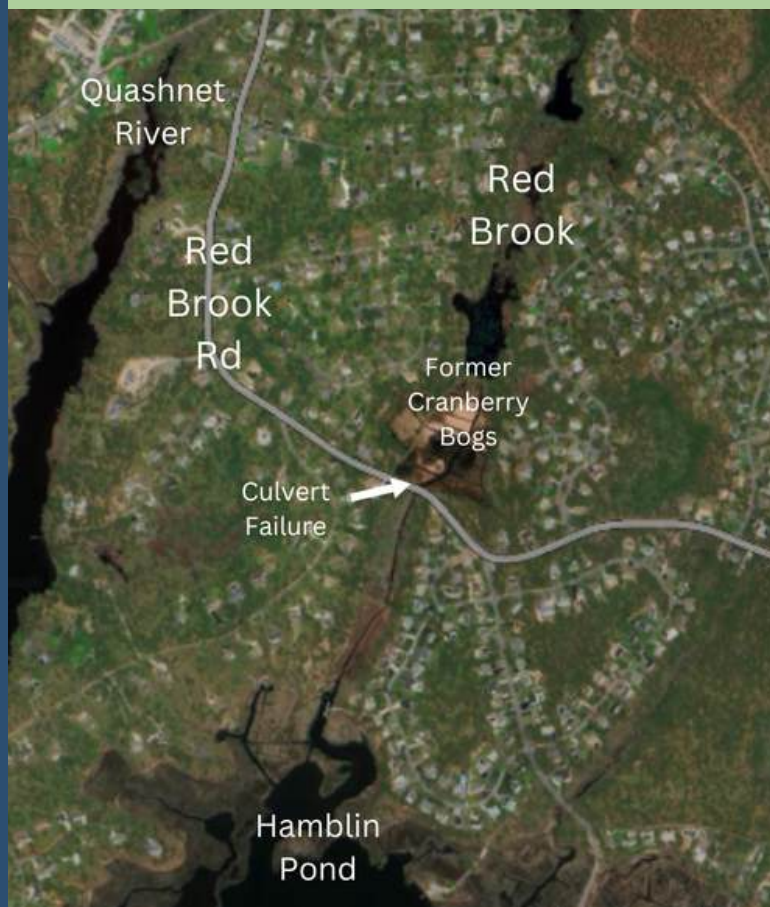
Red Brook

Falmouth/Mashpee

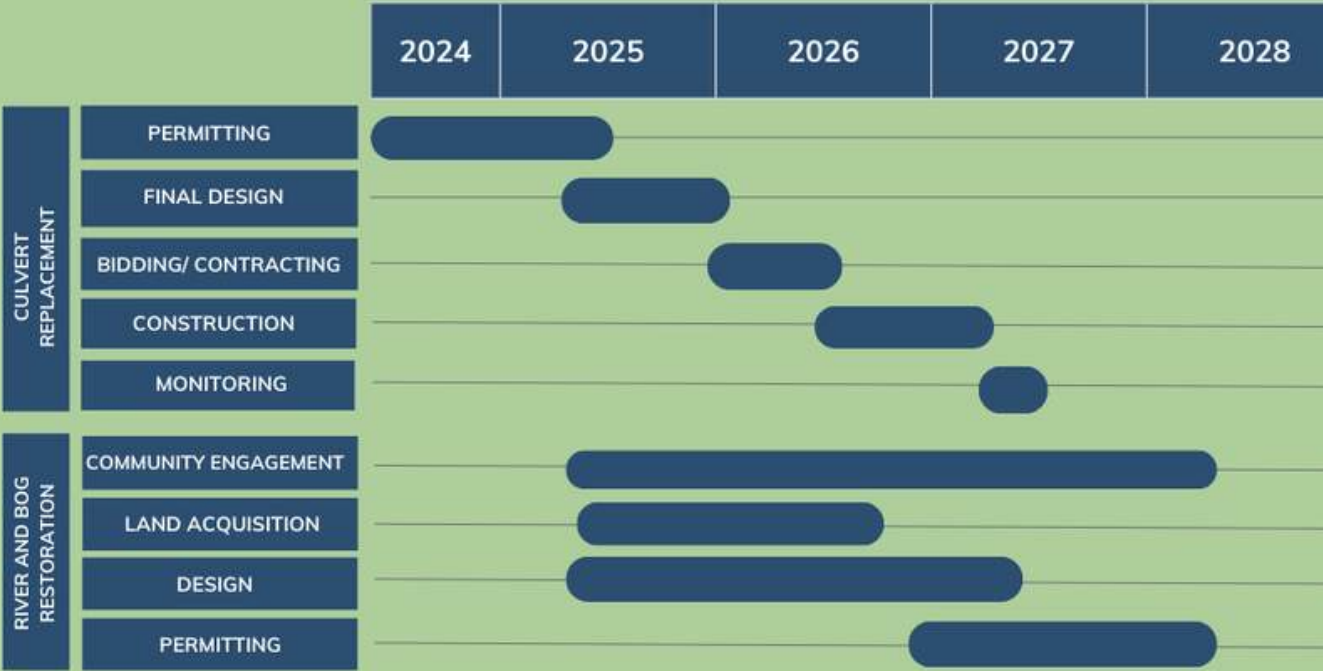
The Red Brook Road culvert, shared by Mashpee and Falmouth, is severely damaged, blocking fish passage and water flow. Immediate repairs are needed to fix the failed culvert and dam. The project aims to restore the entire river, including acquiring and conserving lands. Community input is crucial to shape the restoration plan. Engineers are working on designs to remove the old structure, raise the road for better flood protection, and improve water quality. Next steps involve completion of the culvert replacement and planning for the full river and bog restoration.

- Total Project Cost: \$2,184,180
